

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

March 10, 2019

My Dear People:

As we come now to the First Sunday of Lent, we are invited to be "Living Lent with Love." This is the title of a little booklet inspired by the writing of Pope Francis. Help yourself to a copy at our church doors.

It was love which drew Jesus to the waters of the Jordan to receive the baptism by John the Baptist. It was the divine Spirit of love which then led Jesus into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. True is best manifested when it receives inferior offers. True love proves itself when it is tested.

The devil, who has no love in his heart, tempted the fasting Jesus to eat bread. However, when you are in love, food seems less important. Having our belly filled becomes more of an afterthought when our heart is full of love. I recall an old song from my early childhood: "I have love in my tummy!"

The devil, who has no love in his heart, then tempted Jesus with all the kingdoms of the world and something else to worship, himself! This is what the devil does: He worships himself. However, when you are in love, you do not think of yourself as much as the other. You want to spend your life on the other. You want to lift them up and celebrate their

wonderfulness. With love, it's no longer all about you!

The devil, who has no love in his heart, finally tempted Jesus with the notion of throwing himself down from the parapet of the temple, just to prove that God's angels would support and save him. However, love does not ask to be proven. It stands on its own reality, its own experience, its own awareness and knowing. It has no need to be tested; the need to test love actually reveals its absence.

This is not to say that loving words and actions are without meaning or purpose: They manifest love! They express love! They allow us to give expression to what already exists in our hearts: Divine Love! When our hearts are full of divine love, all other created persons and things become opportunities for divine love to be expressed, for they can never replace the greatest of all loves: Divine Love!

Temptations will never cease, but our hearts will only be full and satisfied when the greatest love prevails: Divine Love! As we strive to be Living Lent with Love, may we love the Lord our God with all of our mind, heart and soul; only then are we able to love our neighbor as ourselves. We love like Jesus!

Lent and Life: "By our gracious gift each year, your faithful await the sacred paschal feasts with the joy of minds made pure" (Preface of Lent 1). The purpose of Lent is succinctly expressed by this preface. Catechumens prepare for baptism into the paschal mystery. The faithful are reminded of their baptism, and will renew their baptismal vows at the Easter liturgy. Baptism initiates us into the eternal life Christ gives us. The baptized are sons and daughters of God and are members of the Church, the People of Life. The choices of the baptized are therefore to be shaped by their new identity (see Rom 6:6; Eph. 4:17-24). Christ calls the Samaritan woman to repent as she accepts the waters of new life (see John 4:15-24). Lenten repentance is necessary so that God's people may more deeply become who they are. They are called to see their sins more clearly. Hence baptism is known as "illumination." Anyone who makes the Lenten journey is called to be more alert to the attacks on human life and dignity around them. The people of life are called to reject sin and all the devil's works and empty promises (Renewal of Baptismal Promises, Easter Liturgy). The "pro-choice" and "right to die" mentalities are two of those "empty promises" which are firmly rejected by the baptized. A firm rejection of these positions is integral to repentance. Lent is the perfect time for us to call our congregations to a clearer understanding of why this is true, and to lead them to a deeper affirmation of life, both natural and eternal, in the celebration of the Paschal Mystery.
