A Word From Deacon Jim Boorman ...

Paul has it right when, in today's Second Reading from Philippians he says, "... *forgetting what lies behind, but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward my goal, the prize of God's calling, in Christ Jesus.*" God gave us His Son ... He gave His Son to us to take on our sins, and to die for us to justify us to His Father and Our Father ... but He came ... also ... to LEAD us to His Father ... to the Promised Land. But even Jesus the Christ, the Second Person of God Himself, cannot lead us if we do not follow. If we continue to insist that we must do things our own way ... and that we must have control over our lives and go where we please then our Omnipotent God is powerless to save us. Jesus tries very hard to gather us up, as a mother hen gathers her chicks; but if we refuse to follow His lead then there is nothing that He can do ... He will not force us. God created us without us ... but He will not save us without us.

Does it not strike you strange that in today's Gospel, Jesus just bends down, twice, and starts writing in the dirt? Yet, every one of the angry men willing to stone the adulteress drops their stones and

walks away. Why? Because Jesus said that 'whoever is without sin cast the first stone?' No. Because Jesus WAS writing in the dirt. This action referred to Jeremiah 17:13 "*O hope of Israel, Lord! All who forsake you shall be put to shame; The rebels shall be enrolled in the netherworld; they have forsaken the Lord, source of living waters.*" Their names shall be enrolled or written into the dirt ... meaning consigned to the underworld from where they shall never return. In effect, Jesus was judging them and writing their names in the earth, (condemning them to death), *IF* they continued to do their own thing, their own way, and stone the woman ... and the meaning did not escape them.

Much of our difficulty today is that we want to be gods of our own lives and only consign our lives over to God at the last possible moment ... and we truly do not understand how the Holy Scripture refers to us the way that we should ... for our names are being written in the dirt, but, in our stubbornness and aloofness, we are not dropping our stones to escape that judgment.

EASTER TRIDUUM: The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. **Everyone is encouraged to attend all or as many of these holy liturgies as possible.**
