*"I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have
loved you, so you also should love one another." - Jn 13:34*

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER
May 18-19, 2019

My Dear People:

In today's Gospel of John 13, Jesus gives his disciples a new commandment: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." He goes on to say: "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." Sounds good! Who would argue with that? I mean, everyone likes people who are nice, polite, caring, generous and who want to make a difference. So, what is so new about this commandment? Most world religions call us to be a loving person.

The difference is not the command as much as it is the person commanding it. The power of love as Jesus loves, as God loves, is received by us in our relationship with the Son of God, Jesus Christ. This is what makes Christian love different...Jesus Christ! It's not so much about caring more; it's about a caring through Him, with Him and in Him, Jesus Christ.

In today's Gospel, Judas had just left the room of the Last Supper. Judas had heard the voice of Jesus and had spent much time with the Lord. However, it seems that he never received or personally encountered the actual person, the Son of God, Jesus Christ. He had even received his First Holy Communion at the Last Supper. The Real Presence of Jesus Christ was there, but he did not encounter it or open his heart, mind and will to it. As a result, Judas was not changed, nor was his fallen human love.

By contrast, those who remained, who stayed at the

table of the Lord, would go on to give up their very lives for Jesus Christ and for the life of the world. Their fallen human love would be redeemed, restored and elevated to a higher love, to a higher power, to that of divine love. All that would matter to these authentic disciples was staying close to the Lord and loving others as he loved them.

You and I may already know what it is like to meet such people. They seem to be illuminated by the Real Presence, a divine love, a supernatural level of living. While what they do is often similar to what other charitable, kind and loving people also do, there is something different about them. They bring us something more, someone else. They bring us Jesus Christ! "That" is the difference! "This" is what brings power to their loving actions. "Jesus" is the one who is then encountered by us and, when this happens, we are receive more than just love...we receive the very love, life and person who died on the cross, rose from the dead and who desires to give us the gift of eternal life now and for all eternity.

Once that happens, we want what and who these people have and, what's more, we then want to share this, Jesus Christ, with others. "The love of Christ impels us!" Changed ourselves by divine love, we can then change the world with a love which does not come from the world, but from heaven! If such love intrigues us, the table of the Lord now has a vacant chair and the Lord is inviting us, today.

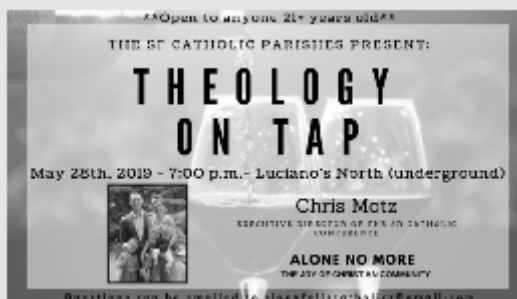
